
When Driving Farm Equipment on Roadways

Allow riders on fenders




Use personal electronics



Drive while tired








Incident Description:

A driver in a small car attempted to pass this sprayer in the evening. A van was traveling in the opposite direction. The van attempted to swerve around the car, but hit the sprayer. The van's driver had difficulty seeing the sides of the sprayer in the dark.



In five years (2005 - 2010), there were more than 7,000 crashes involving farm equipment in the Great Plains region.



Increased lighting was found to be associated with a 50% reduction in crash rates.
