Speaker Bios:

Renée Anthony holds degrees in environmental engineering and is professionally certified in



industrial hygiene and in safety. After working for nearly 10 years in industry as a health and safety specialist, she returned to academia and is a Professor in the Department of Occupational and Environmental Health at the University of Iowa. Her research includes investigation of workplace exposures and their control, including noise, aerosols, and manure gases. She has directed the Great Plains Center for Agricultural Health since 2015.

Jonathan Davis is an Assistant Professor at the University of Iowa's Department of Occupational



and Environmental Health. His research involves analyzing large data sets, and he will present new trends of motor vehicle injury data from the Iowa Trauma Registry to inform attendees of the magnitude of the roadway hazards on Iowa roads.

Cara Hamann is an Associate Professor in the Department of Epidemiology at the University of



Iowa. She contributes to both the Injury Prevention Research Center and the Great Plains Center for Agricultural Health, examining multiple roadway hazards. She will present on her Community Campaign to Reduce Farm-Vehicle Roadway Crashes, incorporating prevention strategies targeting nonfarm vehicle drivers who drive in communities with farm vehicles on the road.

Omar Ahmand is the Deputy Director of the Driving safety institute and is the project manager



for the *Automated Driving Systems for Rural America* project. He has written software related to autonomous vehicle behavior modeling, modeling vehicle systems/interfaces, and other components of assessing vehicle safety and human performance when driving.
